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What are QIN-QIOs?

- Quality Innovation Network-Quality Improvement Organizations (QIN-QIOs) are independent private organizations that work with a variety of healthcare providers across care settings to implement data-driven quality initiatives designed to
 - increase patient safety,
 - decrease harm,
 - engage patients and families,
 - increase clinical care and
 - improve care transitions.
- Advance Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) efforts to improve healthcare quality and outcomes under a national umbrella
- Help beneficiaries acquire the information, skills and confidence they need to take control of their health and health care





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QIN-QIO Technology Focus Areas

- ☒ Increase Electronic Health Record (EHR)-based reporting of clinical quality measures (eQMs)
- ☒ Promote creation of population-based quality improvement reports by identifying at-risk patients by age or disease
- ☒ Promote use of clinical decision support, registry functions, preventive reminders, data analytics and Health Information Exchange (HIE)




QIN-QIO Technology Focus Areas

- ☒ Motivate and support those who are not eligible for EHR incentives (such as behavioral health, post-acute and long term care providers) so they realize the true benefits of health information technology (HIT)
- ☒ Encourage use of innovative HIT applications to promote engagement by patients and/or family members
